Development proposal for Division Street hits a wall

A plan to develop 78 acres of the Tryner farm that sits between Division and Center Streets was brought to the city of Braidwood's Planning and Zoning Board this week.

But the hearing turned into what can only be described as a hot mess, with residents yelling at the developer, the members of the zoning board, and in some cases, each other.

The property, located at 1121 N. Division St., is owned by Ensure Construction, which is operated by developer Michael Guinta.

Guinta, whose construction company has also built dozens of homes inside the Townes of Braidwood subdivision, purchased the property in December 2022 for \$537,972.

Last month, signs announcing the public hearing for development of the land went up along Division Street, and neighbors in close proximity were notified of the public hearing via certified mail.

But when those notices were also shared on social media, residents immediately expressed frustration with the site being developed, and the lack of information regarding those plans.

Per the public notice, which was also printed in the July 19 and July 26 editions of the *Braidwood Journal*, the public hearing was being held "for a zoning amendment to allow multi-family residential fronting on Center, business/commercial on Division, and Industrial on interior."

The hearing notice did not include information about annexation, which would need to be complete along with any other zoning amendments as the property is not currently within the city limits.

More than 50 people attended the hearing on Monday, Aug. 7 at City Hall.

Guinta kicked off the hearing with a brief presentation on the project, which included only vague descriptions of his plans for the property.

"This is a proposal, it's a suggestion as to what we would think is best for this property," Guinta said. "You may not think so, which is perfectly fine. We're open for discussion, we're open for changes, we're open for something that will be good for the tax base here that won't be a demand on the school system... We're looking for employment, a lot of people could walk to work here, several of which have asked me about this. So, we tried to create something that will work for me, I'm in the business to make money. But, I'm also in the business to make communities better, and that's why we want your input."

Guinta said the property was unique, because it presented with potential for multiple types of development.

The proposal, which did not include any specific drawings, would include commercial development along Division Street, such as retail/shopping developments, industrial/warehouse

in the center, and four-story apartment buildings fronting Center Street. Guinta said there would also be water retention in the center/industrial area, to not cause issues with flooding or stormwater retention.

But when the planning and zoning board opened the public hearing, the room erupted into chaos, with few people following the rules of order and instead shouting out their questions, concerns, and objections to the development.

When asked how many apartments are anticipated for the multi-family residential area of the development, Guinta's response drew an audible collective gasp from the crowd.

"It could be 400," Guinta said. "If you have ever traveled I-55 at Cass Avenue, if you're familiar with that area, right behind public works there is a five-story all brick condo building. Beautiful. Very nice buildings, that's what I would work on that end, four stories."

That comment immediately prompted several comments about the burden so many people could place on the school system. Guinta also did not have any preliminary drawings for apartments, but did say there would likely be

multiple buildings.

From there, questions came from a handful of people who took to the microphone, but most of those questions came as shouts from the room.

Asked about what kind of jobs the development could create, Guinta said that was still open.

"We're looking for manufacturers, we're looking for a Menards, we're looking for a Walmart, we're looking for those kinds," Guinta said.

When asked if the apartment complex was meant to accommodate Section 8 housing, Guinta said he had no intention of creating Section 8/low income housing, but was not clear if he would be the landlord of the site or if the residential buildings would be sold or under a management company.

Residents also had questions about truck traffic, the burden a large residential and industrial/commercial development could place on the police and fire districts, the development being placed on old coal mine shafts, adding additional store fronts when vacant properties are already in town, heavy traffic on the predominantly residential Center Street, and flooding.

One of the biggest concerns raised was whether such a large development would impact the small town feel of Braidwood, with residents arguing that they moved to Braidwood to avoid a heavy concentration of people and industrial businesses.

"Maybe we'll just do this whole thing industrial, how about that," Guinta responded to a question about whether Braidwood can handle an influx of residents.

"If we don't have answers and we don't have control, then we should probably just

Zoo animals remain caged as property development stalls

More than a year after the City of Braidwood eyed the site of the Braidwood Zoo for potential retail development, there's still no sign of anything changing at the roadside attraction.

City Administrator Tony Altieri said that at this time, any changes with the property are in a holding pattern.

"We've have proposals from people who'd like to come in and build businesses there, but at this point none of them have followed through or

had success with their corporate entities OKing that spot to build on," Altieri said. "If someone was to come up and ask us, is that for sale, we'd like to put this business there, we would entertain it."

The city has made efforts to clean up the area a bit, mending the broken fence around the zoo, removing the broken flag pole, and adding flowers to the landscaping.

However, as the years go on, the animals have no choice but to weather along with the hot summers and cold winters.

Love's Travel Center construction could start this fall in Wilmington

WILMINGTON — After a contentious public hearing last November, the Wilmington City Council approved an Annexation agreement that will allow Love's to build a Travel Center at River Road and Route 53.

But despite the initial timeline to break ground this past spring, dirt has yet to be moved.

This month, the Wilmington City Council approved an amendment to that annexation agreement, fixing an issue that was helping to create the delay.

On Aug. 1, a public hear-

ing was held on that amendment, which included a change to the legal description of the map of the property.

City attorney Bryan Wellner told members of the council that the entrance drive into the property was not included properly on the initial map of the property in the initial agreement. Wellner said there was also a scrivener's error on the description of the property which was being struck in the amendment.

say no," one person yelled.

Board member Greg Boyer read off a list of questions and concerns that he had with regard to the proposal. Boyer also serves as the president of the Reed-Custer School Board.

"When you hear 400 apartments and you also served on the school board for 19 years, we like to keep our class sizes down, 15 to 18 kids to a classroom," Boyer said. "Four-hundred units, even if it's one kid every other unit, that's 200 kids, there's another 15 classrooms."

Boyer also said he'd like to see traffic impact studies, environmental studies on the flood plans and coal mine shaft areas, and a development timeline created, as well as firmer plans presented before the zoning board looks into the plans any deeper.

But, as the hour-long meeting began to wind down, folks got angry again,

shouting out everything from words not suitable for print to accusations of officials being on the take.

Zoning Chair George Kocik tried to settle the crowd with regard to the need for Braidwood to grow.

"There have been a lot of valid questions asked, in my mind as well as yours," Kocik said. "People talk about growth around us, it's a small town. Braidwood is not going to avoid that. I'm not saying that I want this proposal, but Braidwood is not going to avoid that. On south Broadway and Reed Street in Coal City, they're selling rail line industrial parking. In Wilmington, south of Lorenzo Road, they've got 2-million square foot businesses there. That's going to go all the way down to where 129 is. That's going to bring traffic in here, that's going to bring growth around us. It's going to happen, whether I like it or you like it or he likes it."

Residents took a moment to shout out that they do not in fact like it.

"The second thing I want to say,

because there are so many valid questions... unless I get a different thought from anyone on the board here, I'd like to table this, because there are so many valid questions to a future hearing. We've got to ask a lot of questions to the city attorney, to the city engineer, get together with [Guinta] and settle up some of these very valid questions, which I agree with."

Ultimately, the board decided unanimously to table any potential vote on the issue and end the meeting. That means, however, that the public hearing has been continued until a future meeting, and there is no requirement for additional public notice for future meetings.

The continuance of the hearing will be included on any agenda for a future zoning meeting, which is available at least 48 hours prior to any meeting.

"My next proposal will be a little more desirable, maybe not to everybody," Guinta said.

The planning and zoning board meets the first Monday of each month at 7 p.m. at City Hall.

"There's nothing of substance changing with the project," Wellner said. "The amount of land, the location of the drive that Love's discussed at length at the last hearing is staying exactly the same."

Alderman Kevin Kirwin questioned why the amendment took so long, considering the initial timeline to break ground this past spring.

"We were under the impression that they were supposed to break ground some time... in March, and be done by May. It's already August," Kirwin said. "I'm just asking why it would take that long to figure this out."

Wellner noted that once it was discovered that the legal description was incorrect, there were further discussions on whether Love's needed to purchase additional property to accommodate that driveway, causing some delays.

Love's Real Estate Project manager Chad Bruner said in addition to the change to the property description, there had been some permitting issues with the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT).

"We were expecting to be

underway this spring, but IDOT was holding us up on approvals," Bruner said. "We also had an issue where we thought we were going to have to move the drive, so again that was kind of a thing that probably took a couple of months to work through. That's kind of the latest. Right now we don't have a construction schedule."

While there is no specific date due to that IDOT permitting delay, Bruner said Love's hopes to break ground in late summer, but if not, expect movement in the spring of 2024.

Love's intends to develop 11 acres of the 32 acre parcel to include a 13,000 square foot travel center and fast food restaurant, car and diesel gas pumps, truck scales, 62 car parking spaces, and 71 truck parking spaces. The site will include construction of a private road into the new development between Kankakee River Drive and River Road. The plan represents a \$15 million investment from Love's.

Included in the agreement is a provision to conduct a second traffic study within the next 10 years, and for Love's to contribute to the addition of a stoplight if traffic and IDOT require it.

The agreement will also require the addition of turn lanes on Route 53.

When the project was first brought to the city, members of the public raised concerns over the project, including diesel pollution, traffic noise, air quality, light pollution, increased garbage, the potential to negatively impact property values for homes in Water's Edge, Northcrest and Foxtail Commons, negative effects on other local businesses, the potential for added crime, and the potential to increase truck traffic in an area already saturated with trucks.

A public hearing was held before the city's Planning and Zoning Board on Nov. 3, 2022 ended with the board unanimously voting for the council to reject the proposal.

But on Nov. 15, 2022, about 30 members of the public attended a second hearing on the site, asking the council to adhere to the zoning board's recommendation.

While members of the public expressed frustration that the issue was forwarded to the full City Council, the Planning and Zoning Board serves as a recommending body to the city, and are not the final say on any given project.

However, because the Planning and Zoning Board failed to recommend approval, the annexation proposal needed a supermajority—a total of six yes votes of aldermen—to approve the agreement.

Those who spoke out against the plans cited concerns that trucks and truck traffic are already wreaking havoc on the city and its roads, and building a truck stop only benefits those damaging trucks, not residents.

But city leaders said without the annexation agreement, the truck stop can seek approvals through Will County, meaning the truck stop is likely to be built regardless. Approving the plans means the city has a say in how the project moves forward.

At that time, Aldermen also noted that the addition of the travel center could help make up for some of the revenue that will be lost when D'Orazio Ford and Arnie Bauer Buick, which also took over operations of Community GMC, move out of Wilmington. Those dealerships have signed a development agreement to move to Braidwood by the end of 2024.

The final vote was 6-1, with Alderman Kevin Kirwin the lone no vote. Alderman Leslie Allred was not present at that Nov. 15 meeting.

The council approved the Amendment by a vote of 6-1, with Alderman Kirwin voting no. Alderman Todd Holmes was absent from the meeting.

placed at the site in 2012. In May of 2022, in a 3-1 vote, the council approved a resolution authorizing the sale of surplus real estate that makes up the site.

City leaders said commercial development was always the plan for the site, which was first acquired by the city back in 2008.

The potential development is expected to incorporate the entire property as a combination of the two lots.

The properties—151 N. Front St. and 305 E. Oak St.—were acquired by the city in 2008 and 2011, respectively, and in 2012 the combined sites were turned into the zoo and picnic area and roadside attraction. The animals were purchased by local businesses from Barker's estate after his passing, and the fencing around the zoo was provided by Exelon, now Constellation Energy.

A flagpole was added in 2016, but that flagpole was removed after it was damaged.

In 2013, Braidwood was awarded \$116,800 from the state's Open Space Lands Acquisition and Development program (OSLAD). However, after the award, the state began putting more and more conditions on the funding, which the city couldn't meet. Therefore the grant funding never arrived, despite an OSLAD sign being placed on the pavilion.

Carbon Hill, Coal City awarded improvement funds

Over \$1.4 million in federal funding has been awarded to the villages of Carbon Hill and Coal City for public infrastructure and housing rehabilitation projects.

Gov. JB Pritzker announced on Aug. 4 that the villages were among 54 communities across the state to be awarded a portion of \$56.9 million in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG).

Carbon Hill will receive \$784,970 for public infrastructure improvements aimed at making critical repairs to water, sewer and drainage infrastructure.

"Since day one as Governor, it has been my priority to ensure that every family, individual, and child in Illinois has access to safe and healthy water, housing, and infrastructure," said Governor JB Pritzker. "That's what my administration's Rebuild Illinois capital plan is all about and now, in further partnership with the federal government, over 50 projects across Illinois will receive grants to support projects that will better our communities for years to come."

Coal City was awarded \$650,000 in housing rehabilitation funds, the second round of funding granted to the community.

"Communities in every corner of the state should have access to resources to keep Illinois families safe and healthy with a proper roof over their heads," said DCEO Director Kristin Richards. "The Community Development Block Grants will provide critical assistance to rehabilitate dozens of homes and improve infrastructure in the areas that need it the most without placing the sole burden of funding costly projects on local entities."

The funds awarded to Carbon Hill will allow the village to rehab the interiors and exteriors of approximately 10 owner-occupied single family homes.

The CDBG dollars are overseen by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO).

The housing dollars are earmarked to assist low to moderate income homeowners complete repairs such as new roofs and windows, as well as kitchen and bath renovations, and making spaces handicapped accessible.

The financial award can be utilized across the entire village rather than a specific neighborhood as with the first housing rehabilitation project.

The village of Braceville and city of Morris were also awarded \$650,000 in housing rehab funds.

A total of \$8.4 million in housing rehabilitation assistance was awarded to 13 communities to invest in 135 housing projects.

The dollars awarded to Carbon Hill are a portion of \$48.5 million for 41 infrastructure projects designed to provide undeserved communities with the funds necessary to improve public infrastructure and eliminate conditions detrimental to public health, safety and welfare.

The projects include construction of storm sewer pipes, waterline replacements, hydrant and water storage tank construction and projects to help mitigate flooding and support sewage management, water delivery and other public water necessities.

The village of Verona will also receive infrastructure funds totaling \$490,881 in public infrastructure.

Busiest roadside mowing period gets underway

The Illinois Department of Transportation is reminding the public that the roadside mowing period is underway, requiring drivers to slow down, avoid all distractions and proceed with caution when encountering equipment and personnel. The heaviest mowing operations will continue until Aug. 15.

"As we enter our peak mowing season, please remember to reduce your speed, drop the devices and drive extra carefully if you encounter workers. At the end of the day, we want everyone to get home safely," said Illinois Transportation Secretary Omer Osman.

During the summer, IDOT conducts two primary types of mowing. Safety mowing occurs directly adjacent to the road as needed. Maintenance mowing, which lasts for approximately six weeks and started July 1, includes areas next to culverts, ditches, traffic control devices and other structures, while following the Illinois Monarch Project Mowing Guidelines for Pollinators, protecting as much habitat and nectar resources as possible.

The mowing schedule helps to minimize the impact on the traveling public and encourage pollinator activity, which assists in the reproduction of flowers, fruits and vegetables that are essential to the state's ecosystem and economy.

Reducing the amount of land maintained and growing pollinator habitat also protects the endangered rusty patched bumble bee and the monarch butterfly, the official state insect of Illinois.

In 2020, IDOT joined in the launch of the Illinois Monarch Project, a collaborative effort with local and state partners to help ensure the survival and successful migration of monarchs by increasing and protecting habitat.

Putting it in print, a letter to the editor

The newspaper is, and always has been, a bully pulpit. Whether it's a letter to the editor, or a sound off, airing opinions is a time honored tradition. Today we look at one letter to the editor from June 17, 1871 from someone who obviously hated politics, politicians and most of all taxes.

Just the week before this letter was printed, the entire town had met to vote on incorporation. The meeting was taken over by a mob resulting in the men favoring incorporation jumping out of a window to save themselves.

A newspaper called the Western Miner had published several articles about the advantages of incorporation in Braidwood. Our letter is in response to that and was printed in the Wilmington Advocate. After a bit of ranting about kings and sovereigns the letter goes on to state why the writer was against incorporation.

"1st. Our young town is very prosperous independent of Incorporation

2nd. We are sufficiently burdened by taxa-

tion, without increasing the burden by our own folly.

3rd. Whereas, in our praiseworthy efforts to build homes, schools, churches, etc., for intellectual, moral and religious instruction and principles, whereby the young and old may be led in the paths of morality and virtue, and whereas, the heavy taxes of Government, State, county and Town in addition to the above, we do not feel able or willing to feed the rapacious and gormandizing appetite of corporate officers and their pets, at present.

4th. It is a well acknowledged fact that the officers of nearly all corporate bodies have oppressive laws and that they are despotic and tyrannical in the extreme, and that we could expect nothing better from those who desire to be elected to office by our votes.

5th. That we believe that the laws of the land are as much respected now, as they would be were we incorporated, and had a thousand ordinances to observe made by a few men elected to power by a few of our number.

6th. That by observing the facts and sad experience of many of the young towns, we learn, and some of us have felt to our sad experience, that the inexorable tax collector, by some reason or other, can put his hand just as

deep into the pocket of the people as the conscience of the town council will allow, and it has led some to believe that they have no conscience at all.

7th. That the seemingly plausible reasoning of some men supported, as they believe, by scraps of law, are trying to gull the people and make them believe that we can have nicely graded streets and good sidewalks, and have the laws respected and enforced for a mere nominal sum. The experience of other towns is contrary to such sophistry.

8th. That with two justices of the peace and two very efficient constables, with power to add to their number if necessary, we feel as safe in life and property as we would if we had to support a dozen dead-heads, believing them to be an honor to our village.

9th. That in the event of election to put in power these leeches of society, political animosity, jealousies and hard feelings might arise in our midst contrary to our desire and to the present good and friendly feeling that now exists among us.

10th. That we believe that the inexcusably false teachings of some who are afflicted with a disease pronounced by skill to be "Corporation of the brain," caused by too strong a desire to

make a big haul out of the baskets of loaves and fishes, and to try to make the people see through their eyes to make themselves believe that they can have graded streets, nice sidewalks, a police magistrate, constables, assessors, collector, town clerk, street commissioners, treasurer and town clerk, with all incidental expense, such as rent, fuel, light and the publishing their proceedings in their little paper, the so called Western Miner; all this would be big trade for the columns of that paper, while their furniture, stationery and a few other necessities, all can be done on a 50 per cent of assessed valuation. It is like a boy with a few pennies in his pocket, thinking to buy a fine span of horses and carriage, whose very walk and demeanor shows that he feels himself of some importance.

In conclusion, we, the citizens of Braidwood, deem it unnecessary to give this affair any further notice."

He concluded his letter with a little poem: "Raving minds and frantic screams, Of brains diseased with corporation, Need but rebuff and conduct votes, To turn their worldly aspirations."

Now that, my friends is a letter to the editor!

Wilmington sets its sights on the roads

The city of Wilmington is finally moving ahead with much anticipated roadwork projects.

The plan to repave Water Street was slated to get underway this week. While the work did not begin by the anticipated Aug. 7 start date, the plans call for a complete repaving of Water Street from Baltimore/Route 53 to Chicago Street, a much anticipated makeover for the downtown thoroughfare that has been plagued with potholes for the past several years.

The work, which does not include sidewalks or curbs, was added to this year's streets program after other slated projects came in under budget, as well as the availability of additional funds from the High Speed Rail project.

But, after the road is redone, one issue not yet decided is the parking situation downtown.

On Aug. 1, during a discussion held among the members of the City Council on roadwork plans, Alderman Ryan Jeffries said that while the initial plan is to make Water Street parallel parking for all vehicles, he'd like to see a different option when the parking gets striped.

Jeffries said turning the entire street into parallel parking would mean fewer spots. But, he said, the city has other options.

"We could gain so much if we move the centerline of the road over two feet, and put parallel on one side and angled all down the other," Jeffries said. "If we put angled down the east side starting... just past Hayden's, and run that all the way down to the park district, and just had parallel on the other side, we'd pick up almost 20 spots."

Mayor Ben Dietz said no spots were being eliminated, because striping was being added down the length of Water Street downtown, which had not previously been marked for parking.

City leaders said the decision was not yet set in stone and could be discussed at a future committee meeting.

Water Street isn't the only

planned summer road maintenance.

The city was also expected to begin work this week on Daniels Street, and on two sections of Kahler Road, including resurfacing from Water Street to Wildcat Court, as well as tar and chip from Butcher Lane to Barr Road.

Public Works Director James Gretencord said there may be a delay on the chip sealing portion of that roadwork due to the contractor. That tar and chip work will be the last of the roadwork completed.

Tar and chip differs from asphalt resurfacing in that tar and chip is a road sealing process that involves evenly spreading asphalt chip aggregate into the road, covering it with a heat seal, and rolling it smooth.

"[We plan to take] grindings from the three projects in town, take them out there, mix them in with the existing aggregate, add extra aggregate as needed to make sure we have the base we need, and then the chip seal on top," Gretencord told members of the City Council during that meeting on Aug. 1.

Tar and chip is durable and long term, and is a cheaper option than traditional asphalt repaving. But, it can be messy, which is part of the reason it is not usually utilized in busier municipal streets. Grindings go down first to build the base, then the seal is added.

While work on Water Street, Daniels Street, and Kahler Road between Water Street and Wildcat Court should take about 20 days, the tar and chip portion should take about 45 days to complete. That portion of Kahler Road will also be closed to through traffic during construction.

The anticipated cost of all three projects is \$975,000, with those dollars coming via Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) funds.

MFT funds are monies collected at the pump by the state, then redistributed to municipalities and road districts and earmarked for road projects.

"Part of pavement preservation that we've been talking about is, yes it's very important

that we're getting to all the roads and the ones that are, for lack of better words, in terrible shape. Those are getting done," Gretencord said. "But there's a two-part problem. The roads haven't been preserved in years past to prolong them as long as possible. We're dealing with a limited budget as every town in Illinois is, you have to get every penny out of that road in order for MFT to keep up as well as possible."

Meanwhile, the city council also on Aug. 1 approved an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) to create a Pavement Management Plan.

The city first applied for those grant funds in 2022 to create that pavement plan, which involves a vehicle traveling city roads and collecting information with photo imaging and lasers. That vehicle mapping began over the past two weeks.

The result will be a custom maintenance/replacement plan for city streets as well as a study to determine the condition of Wilmington roads which will be used to help guide the city with which projects should be prioritized.

The agreement is for technical assistance, which is being offered through CMAP as part of their "ON TO 2050" long range plan.

That comprehensive plan includes providing such assistance to communities in Will, as well as Cook, DuPage, Kane, Kendall, Lake, and McHenry counties, as a means of advancing the plan's implementation and CMAP priorities.

Per the agreement, the city will pay \$3,000 to CMAP for the assistance, funds which will be deposited into CMAP's Local Technical Assistance Contribution Fund. That fund supports the development and promotion of the goals and policies of the Regional Comprehensive Plan.

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10-year expected condition changes, highlight and recommend specific preventative maintenance and minor rehabilitation activities, and develop recommended budget scenarios for 5 to 10 year period varying by expected local funding availability.

More big brother



The art of doing good

How 18-year-old is saving the salmon by painting murals

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When you have big dreams, you need a big canvas. Austin Picinich's dreams center on his home state of Washington and its dwindling salmon population.

While streams flow down-hill into the ocean, salmon make their way upstream to spawn. But recent droughts, commercial development and pollution have made it difficult for salmon to make the journey. Juanita Creek was hit particularly hard, and while conservation groups were already at work, what the effort needed was more public attention. Restoring the creek would require the entire community to be aware of the issues and imagine what the creek would be like restored to its former abundant condition.

Austin went to work using his artistic talents to make a difference. He created Save Our Salmon through Art (SOS)

and then found the perfect wall in the community to house a mural bringing focus to the issue. Then he enlisted neighbors, friends and volunteers to bring it all to life.

"The thing about paint is that you can make mistakes and just paint over it," says Austin. "And then it will be perfect."

This philosophy of just working at it until you get it right is embodied in another organization Austin is working with: SalmonWatchers, led by biology professor Jeff Jensen. Like Austin's philosophy on painting, the SalmonWatchers program takes a fresh look at the mistakes of the past and gives the streams a makeover. Teams of SalmonWatchers volunteers are building egg incubators and natural resources for salmon to thrive. But the effort is more than a few people can accomplish. And that's where Austin put his skills to work.

By creating murals — big murals — in communities

where depleted streams run, Austin is raising awareness of the need for all to get involved. He begins a project by first outlining the mural and color-coding the sections. Then he organizes a community painting day, and volunteers show up, glad to be part of a project that supports bringing the salmon back.

So far, Austin's efforts have involved over 20 communities and nearly 400 volunteers and raised more than \$18,000 for stream restoration efforts. Austin smiles, clutching a handful of well-used paintbrushes: "I've learned that the power of WE can start with one person, even if that one person is just a high schooler who likes art."

As nature reclaims her place in our lives, we become more aware of the diversity of beauty around us. We are happier when surrounded by the abundance of life — and the good friends we enjoy it with.

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





A recipe made for garden vegetables

Let the harvest begin. Our garden is thriving with fresh vegetables and there is nothing that makes me happier than watching my little one go to the garden to pick a fresh organic vegetable to get ready to prep for dinner.

I have found that my kids are more willing to try a new meal if it has grown from the garden and they have helped prepped the meal. So I found this great recipe with a healthy twist on tacos that is sure to use up a lot of fresh vegetables from the garden.

It is called zucchini taco boats. I mean what kid could pass up eating a boat and plus it is filled with nutritious and alkaline vegetables.

I read a book once about the Dr. Sebi alkaline diet and he argued that disease cannot exist in an alkaline environment. So filling up on alkaline fruits and vegetables is key for our health which is another reason I love this recipe.

Ingredients

- 4 zucchini
- 1 cup salsa
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 1 pound ground beef
- 2 tablespoons taco seasoning
- 1 cup of rice you prefer, cooked
- 2 cloves chopped garlic
- 1 bell pepper, chopped
- 1 cup chopped zucchini, reserved
- salt and pepper to taste
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 1/4 cup chopped cilantro, optional
- 1/4 cup diced cherry tomatoes optional

First pre-heat the oven to 350 degrees. While the oven heats up go ahead and trim the top and bottom of zucchini off. Lay the zucchini flat and slice in half lengthwise. Repeat with all four zucchini.

Next, using a spoon, scoop the center of the zucchini out leaving 1/4 inch wall around the bottom and sides of the zucchini. Repeat with each zucchini half. I like to reserve 1 cup of the zucchini meat from the center of the zucchini and give it a rough chop. We will use this in the filling.

Next, add a thin layer of salsa to the bottom of a baking

dish and lay the zucchini boats on top. You may need two dishes to fit all of the zucchini.

In a large non stick skillet, heat olive oil. Once the oil is hot, add in the onion along with a pinch of salt. Once the onion is translucent, push to the side and add in ground beef.

Season with salt and break up into crumbles. Add taco seasoning and stir to coat.

Next, add in the cooked rice, garlic, bell pepper and zucchini 'meat'. Season with a little more salt and pepper and stir.

Tip: If you like to stay away from too many starches and keep it really healthy, sometimes I use cauliflower rice. Berkots sells a good one in the frozen section by Green Giant

Now you have a healthy, fun meal from mother nature.

New law will help with police officer shortage

Republican U.S. Rep. Mary Miller helped ignite a firestorm over the weekend of July 29th when she expressed her disgust on social media with Gov. JB Pritzker.

Miller (no relation) claimed on Twitter that Pritzker had signed a bill late on a Friday afternoon "to allow illegal immigrants to become police officers, giving non-citizens the power to arrest citizens in our state."

Miller continued by claiming: "No sane state would allow foreign nationals to arrest their citizens, this is madness!" Her more well-known Republican colleague Lauren Boebert amplified the issue the next day and Fox News picked up the ball and ran with it. The rest of the right-wing media soon followed and a typical feeding frenzy ensued.

Trouble is, Rep. Miller's own husband, state Rep. Chris Miller (R-Oakland) (also no relation), voted "Yes" on the House's initial version of the bill, which would've allowed non-citizens to become police officers.

Ops.

House Bill 3751 cleared the House on a unanimous roll call on March 24th. It specifically struck out an existing state law which prohibited sheriffs and law enforcement from employing non-citizens as law enforcement officers. The bill then added language allowing those non-citizens who are "legally authorized to work in the United States under federal law," and who received federal approval to "obtain, carry, or purchase or otherwise possess a firearm," to become law enforcement officers.

The bill was supported by various groups, including the Chicago Fraternal Order of Police, and passed 101-0. One of the bill's chief co-sponsors was Rep. John Cabello (RMachesney Park), a Donald Trump-supporting police offi-

cer.

After the bill arrived in the Senate, its sponsor added an amendment allowing people, "against whom immigration action has been deferred by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services under the federal Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) process," to also become police officers.

Sen. Dan McConchie (R-Hawthorne Woods), the former Senate Republican Leader, voted for that version, but all other Senate Republicans opposed the bill as amended, as did two Democrats, Sens. Patrick Joyce (D-Reddick) and Willie Preston (D-Chicago).

Most all House Republicans stood firm during their chamber's motion to concur with the new Senate amendment, including House Republican Leader Tony McCombie. Not one member of McCombie's leadership team voted against the motion, which passed 100-7. However seven of the eight members of the House's self-declared "Freedom Caucus" voted against it, including Rep. Miller. The eighth member, Rep. David Friess (R-Red Bud) had an excused absence.

Gov. Pritzker eventually pointed out on Twitter that House members, "including those who are now complaining about it," had voted for the bill before the Senate Republicans "started spreading lies."

State Rep. Miller responded to the governor online by claiming his own vote against "legislation allowing non-citizens to arrest actual citizens," paled in comparison to Pritzker's "blatantly attacking the Constitutional [sic] right of

honest citizens to bear arms."

But, again, state Rep. Miller did indeed vote to allow "non-citizens to arrest actual citizens." His spouse, the congressperson, tweeted at Pritzker the same day that "Giving foreign nationals the power to arrest U.S. citizens in Illinois is not 'common sense.'" Ms. Miller should've maybe had a talk with her husband last spring.

As you might imagine, several House Republicans are eager for this particular news cycle to end. It's enraging the base, and there's some worry that it could lead to some Republican primary challenges.

But Leader McCombie went on a southern Illinois radio station WJPF last week to defend her fellow Republicans who voted for the bill.

"Every single [House] Republican, all 40 of us, voted for this bill," McCombie told host Tom Miller (also no relation). "And that is because what the media is saying is not accurate. You can't have 40

Republicans voting for a bill that is going to have undocumented illegal immigrants become a police officer. That is not gonna happen." She also rightly pointed out that the asylum-seeking migrants pouring into Illinois won't qualify, either, because they're not allowed to work.

McCombie blamed Democrats for creating an environment that is forcing people out of policing as a career. This bill, she said, could help alleviate that problem. And she stressed that only people who could be approved by the federal government to possess and carry a firearm would qualify.

"It is a conditional step to support law enforcement," McCombie said. "It is not, it is not a license to give illegal immigrants, undocumented folks who are coming across our borders illegally, the ability to become law enforcement. Hard stop."

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Tips on grilling green

Dear EarthTalk: I've heard that grilling generates a lot of pollution and greenhouse gases. Are there greener types of grills or grilling methods that are more planet-friendly?

— Bill D., Raleigh, NC

We certainly do love to grill. Whether it's hot dogs, burgers, steaks, salmon or shish-kebab, chances are you and/or your neighbors have grilled it up recently. But all that grilling can't be good for the planet or our carbon footprints.

Researchers in the United Kingdom report that a typical summer barbecue for four people releases more greenhouse gases into the atmosphere than an 80-mile car journey.

There are several types of grills that can contribute to pollution, and your grill is most likely included.

Charcoal grills release more emissions because they are literally burning carbon. If you live in a poorly ventilated area, charcoal grills may not be

the best option since they release particulate matter into the air.

There are two major types of charcoal: lump charcoal, which is roasted wood; and briquettes, which are laced with chemicals and flammables. Both release very toxic volatile organic compounds and carbon monoxide when burned.

But, between both of them, lump charcoal is the more sustainable option.

On the other hand, propane and natural gas grills emit significantly less pollutants than charcoal grills; however, they do burn fossil fuels.

They are more efficient, cooking faster easier, but still release chemicals like Nitrogen oxide, although usually on a smaller scale compared to charcoal grills.

An even better option are electric grills. These might be pricier, but they do significantly reduce emissions and will last a long time without refueling.

They rely on electricity from the grid, so their environmental impact depends on the source of electricity generation.

Choosing renewable energy sources, such as solar or wind power, further enhances the sustainability of electric grills. Similarly, infrared grills use infrared radiation for cooking.

Instead of heating the air around the food, they target the actual metal and food on the grill. They also lock in moisture making them ideal for cooking steaks, burgers and other meats.

Grilling is an integral part

of our culinary culture, but it is essential to acknowledge and address its potential environmental impact.

By embracing sustainable alternatives, such as electric grills or infrared grills, we can still indulge in grilling while minimizing our carbon footprint.

July brought much needed rain

After a couple of dry months, the skies opened up over Grundy County and dropped 6.31 inches of rain in the month of July. One particular storm brought high winds and tornados.

The storm system that blew in on the evening of July 28 downed trees and power lines in many areas of the county and a tornado struck the Grundy County portion of Minooka with 85 mph winds that crossed into Channahon

and 95 mph winds were recorded on the Kendall County side of the village. The National Weather Service has classified the tornados as EF-0 and EF-1, respectively.

Grundy County's peak wind gust was recorded that evening at 50 mph in Morris.

The Grundy County Emergency Management Agency [GCEMA] reports the highest 24-hour precipitation amount was recorded at 1.10 inches on July 13, one of 12 days with measurable rain last month.

The July rains bring total

liquid precipitation for the year to 20.36 inches, over 2 inches shy of where the county was last year.

The average July temperature was 74.1 degrees with a low of 56.9 degrees and a high of 96.8 degrees. There were six days in the month when temps exceeded 90 degrees.

The monthly climatological data summary is compiled from records collected and kept at the GCEMA office in the Grundy County Administration Center at 1320 Union St., Morris.
